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Covid-19 Information

2021 End Of Year Data

Below are our end of year results in Writing. Please note that our data includes all students, including those with special educational needs and new entrant students who may not have completed one full year at school.

2021 Writing Data

Writing continues to be an area of concern and it appears that students made little progress across the year in 2021, despite targeted and deliberate teaching. A Ministry of Education report suggested that in 2020 students' progress in writing appeared to have been impacted by lockdowns and we wonder if this could be a contributing factor in our results.

Strengths:

- Students have an increasing understanding of the different genres of writing

- Students have continued confidence in their ability

Next Steps:

- Focus on ways to motivate boys in writing e.g. link into passions/interests, authentic purposes for writing, use mentor texts for them to refer too.
- Continue to teach a variety of text types and have a focus on grammar and structure of writing.
