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Covid-19

As you are aware, yesterday we were notified of a positive Covid case amongst our school community.

Our school will continue to operate as normal and we continue to follow the Ministry of Health guidelines. Mask wearing is compulsory inside the school and on school transport for Year 4 and above, we ensure students are regularly hand sanitising and desks and other high touch surfaces are cleaned daily.

Please continue to monitor your children for symptoms and if they become unwell please keep them at home. You should have all received a supply of RATs by now. Please let us know if you would like some more as the Ministry have provided the school with a reasonable supply.

Today the new rules regarding vaccine passes come in to effect. This does not bring change to our school as we were not required to check passes previously. We would like to remind you that the country is still under RED on the traffic light system and therefore the following rules still apply around entering the school.

Please drop your children at the gate, we ask that you don't enter the school grounds.

EXCEPTIONS: new entrants and special needs children only can be brought to the deck and dropped there.

If you would like to meet with teachers please ring the office and make an appointment.

Social distancing, masks and signing in are required if parents/whanau are on site for meetings


